Highlights from the March Meeting:

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 by club president David Spoelstra, N9KT. There were 46 in attendance. New members were introduced. David asked for tech questions from the floor. Dave Miller, K9RTT, had an issue with GFCI receptacles tripping when running high power. The suggestion from the floor was this was probably caused by stray RF.

Jim Rinehart, K9RU, reminded those in attendance of the Indiana QSO Party coming up on May 6. Jim suggested those that submit a log to submit it notating the Indianapolis Radio Club as their club. Last year, we placed 3rd in clubs. David noted this is the same date as the Mini-Marathon, but both can be done by getting on the air for the INQP after getting home from working the Mini. David also gave his testimonial again about all the fringe benefits that come with volunteering for the Min-Marathon. Tickets for the bus trip to the Hamvention are still available at the same price as last year, \$30 per person. Due to the new location for Hamvention being further east, the bus will be leaving an

hour earlier than in the past.

The club's chief operator, Jace Thompson, KD9BIG, talked about the Ivy Tech Radio Club. He said that on Wednesdays starting at 12:30 the club station will be open for operating and radio activities. Jace also talked about Field Day, coming up on June 24 and 25. Jace has talked with Tom Chance, K9XV, getting some information regarding past Field Day operations, and plans on having food this year. Jace also said there would probably be some Cub Scouts involved with this year's activities.

David talked about the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Amateur Radio Club, W9IMS, and the need for more operators for the special events that club puts on the air around the races held at the Motor Speedway. David said this year's Christmas Dinner will be held at MCL Castleton. There are several possible speakers being talked about. Jim<K9RU, mentioned that several radios that the club has acquired over the years are for sale to benefit the club. There are several classic radios available. Mike Rollins, WA9NCF, talked about the results Tom Hansen, WA9YI, had working an NVIS antenna test based in Ohio. Mike also mentioned that Harold Davis, K9PZ, passed away today (March 10).

Bob Begeman, W9KVK, talked about a possible scam that he had inadvertently been involved with, where his call sign was used as someone who was selling a radio. He's not.

Jay Wright, KK9L, announced that classes are under way now in Hendricks County, held at the Senior Services Center behind the hospital in Danville.

Next, David introduced Norm Dingle, W9IFW, for his presentation on Go-Boxes. Norm showed some examples of go boxes or go kits. "Go Kits" include personal equipment and gear for survival and necessities. "Go Box" is just communication gear. Not knowing what situation one might be deployed in, need to have everything that might be needed. Go Boxes can be bought ready made from Quicksilver Radio (<http://www.qsradio.com/shop-now.html#!/Go-Kit-Supplies/c/13274007>) and DX Engineering (<https://www.dxengineering.com/search/product-line/dx-engineering-go-kits?autoview=SKU&keyword=go%20kits&sortBy=BestKeywordMatch&sortorder=Ascending>) to mention a couple of

sources. The minimum requirements of a Go Kit include radio, power source, antenna, feed line, microphone, headphones, pad and pencil, license, and something to carry it all in. Additional items that may come in handy include an extension cord, a copy of frequencies used for the event, extra coax, test gear, flashlight, adapters, water, energy bars, HT, batteries, safety vest, tools. Norm stressed to use Anderson Power Poles (<http://www.andersonpower.com/us/en/products/powerpole/>) for power connections. They are the ARRL standard and available from several vendors. Power Poles are available in various colors and amperage ratings. The 15, 30 and 45 amp connectors are the same physical size, with just different size contacts. Always mark your gear with your callsign. Norm stressed for folks to be active, especially in nets, in order to be prepared for real net situations. He suggested taking the FEMA ICS courses. These are required by several served agencies. There are lots of resources available for sharing information, such as a Facebook group. N9TAX, from Hebron, IN, makes and sells roll up JPole antennas for around \$25. N9TAX's web site is <http://www.n9tax.com/>. Norm said he keeps batteries on maintenance charge all the time using the Genius charger from Amazon (https://www.amazon.com/NOCO-G3500-UltraSafe-Battery-Charger/dp/B004LWVEKS/ref=sr_1_1?ie=UTF8&qid=1489195720&sr=8-1&keywords=genius+charger) Norm wrapped up his presentation with a demonstration of go boxes on display from W9IFW, KU9V, NN7C, and K9NQW.

K9NQW announced the Indiana DStar net on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month on Reflector 24B at 7:30 pm local time. Door Prizes from AudioVox were awarded prior to the meeting being adjourned at 8:52 pm.

DOWNTOWN INDY 146.625 BACK ON THE AIR

After being off the air for quite a while, the W9IRA 146.625 repeater is back on the air. It is now a Yaesu System Fusion repeater. However, it is in “auto sensing” mode, so it will operate as a standard analog repeater, with a tone of 88.5 Hz. It also sends out a tone of 88.5, so if you set your analog radio to full CTCSS at 88.5, you won’t hear the digital “hash” when a digital QSO is taking place. However, this means you will need to monitor the frequency prior to placing an analog call to prevent interrupting a digital QSO.
