Remember, all parts of an antenna do not radiate. John had lots of slides to explain and demonstrate slot antennas. There were some good questions afterwards. INQP 2021 COMING MAY 1, WITH SOMETHING NEW!

The Indiana QSO Party is now just a couple of weeks away. This is the chance for Indiana operators to be treated as "rare DX". OK, maybe not THAT rare, but State QSO

parties have really been generating a lot of interest the past couple of years, with the introduction of the State QSO Party Challenge. This is also your chance to “get your feet wet” in contesting. State QSO Parties are where everyone tries to get as many counties in a state as they can. This means that Indiana stations will be trying to get as many other Indiana counties as they can, and stations outside of Indiana will be trying to get as many Indiana counties as they can. This means if conditions are good, you can stay as busy as you want.

This year there are two new “rare county” plaques to be awarded. To qualify, stations must be single county fixed or portable and meet the requirements in the INQP Rules (single operator or Multi-Single). A plaque will be awarded to each of the top two entries with the most logged QSOs from a rare county regardless of power category. Score will be used as a tie-breaker if necessary. Stations must have at least 50 QSOs to be eligible for a plaque. The counties that qualify as “rare” are as follows: Benton, Carroll, Cass, Dearborn, Decatur, Fountain, Fulton, Jay, Jefferson, Montgomery, Newton, Ohio, Owen, Pike, Pulaski, Randolph, Ripley, Rush, Scott, Spencer, Switzerland, and Union.

This year the Indiana QSO Party is on Saturday, May 1, from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm Eastern time (1500 UTC Saturday through 0300 UTC Sunday). **Also, don’t forget about the club competition when submitting your log for the INQP, be sure to designate the “Indianapolis Radio Club” as your club.** There is a club award for the most combined points. INDY RADIO CLUB STARTS “ELMER PROGRAM”

Over the past year, the VE testing sessions sponsored by the Indianapolis Radio Club, as well as those sponsored by other clubs around the state, have been producing lots and lots of new hams. Quite often these new hams get their new license, and then wonder “what next?”. At most testing sessions, the successful candidate is given a sheet of information regarding how to get more involved with their new hobby, but these new hams need more. Unless these new hams have someone to turn to for advice on what radio to get, how to get on area repeaters, where to get their gear and such, the new ham may become disillusioned with the hobby, and in time drop out completely.

At the club’s April Zoom meeting, I announced that we are starting an Elmer program. There is so much knowledge and experience available in the membership of our club just waiting to be accessed. My vision for this program is to establish a list of Elmers around central Indiana. Then we make our program known to the new hams in the welcome

letter we send them, asking them to contact the “Elmer Coordinator”, who can then put them in contact with an Elmer in their area to work with them. Often times, when I have worked with new hams, they just need to know what type of gear they need, and where to get it. Also, a list of local repeaters and “nets” that these new hams can check in to is very valuable to them, allowing them to learn how to get on the air and communicate successfully.

Keep in mind, I am not looking just for hams that have been licensed since the days of spark gap. 





W4DXCC DX & CONTEST CONVENTION COMING UP

September 24 and 25 are the dates for the 2021 W4DXCC. This DX and contest convention takes place in Pigeon Forge, TN, a relatively short, and very scenic drive from central Indiana. The two day event is scheduled to kick off with a “Ham Radio Bootcamp”, making it a great convention for those relatively new to the hobby, or even those that have been hams for a while, but want to brush up on operating techniques. The event wraps up with a banquet (at an extra charge), where you can chat with fellow hams over dinner, comparing notes or “tall tales”. Final planning for the event is still underway. NEW \$35 FCC APPLICATION FEE NOT TAKING EFFECT UNTIL LATER.

The \$35 license application fee, when it becomes effective, will apply to new, modification (upgrade and sequential call sign change), renewal, and vanity call sign applications, as well as applications for a special temporary authority (STA) or a rule waiver. All fees will be per application. Administrative updates, such as a change of mailing or email address, are exempt.

It is expected that such fees will not become effective before summer 2021. The FCC has stated that amateurs will have advance warning of the actual effective date, because it will publish such date in the Federal Register.

The ARRL VEC exam fee will remain at \$15. When the FCC application fee eventually takes effect, new and upgrade applicants will pay the \$15 exam session fee to the VE team as usual and then pay the \$35 application fee directly to the FCC.

UPDATED RF EXPOSURE RULES ARE EFFECTIVE MAY 3

The new rules do not change existing RF exposure (RFE) limits but do require that stations in all services, including amateur radio, be evaluated against existing limits, unless they are exempted. For stations already in place, that evaluation must be completed by May 3, 2023. After May 3 of this year, any new station, or any existing station modified in a way that's likely to change its RFE profile — such as different antenna or placement or greater power — will need to conduct an evaluation by the date of activation or change.

“For most amateurs, the major difference is the removal of the categorical exclusion for amateur radio, which means that ham station owners must determine if they either qualify for an exemption or must perform a routine environmental evaluation,” said Greg Lapin, N9GL, chair of the ARRL RF Safety Committee and a member of the FCC Technological Advisory Council (TAC).
