### **Highlights from the April Meeting:**

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Club President David Spoelstra, N9KT. There were 35 in attendance, including several guests. Recent upgrade Mike Vrabel, KE9BSX, and new member, Jon Brunnemer, KD9NSG were recognized. David asked anyone with ideas for meetings to send a message to [board@indyradioclub.org](mailto:board@indyradioclub.org). He reminded everyone of the April 19 club POTA activation. The move of the Welcome Net to the 146.970 repeater was mentioned. David reminded those present of the Indiana QSO Party coming up on March 3. He also mentioned that volunteers are needed for upcoming 500 Festival events [*more info on these last three items are presented in more detail in this newsletter*]. Ron Cooper, WB9DKL talked about the Heathkit receiver he brought in for display. David also noted that more Volunteer Examiners are needed for the club's monthly testing sessions (contact team leader, [Jim Kadjner, AC9ZL](#) for information on joining the team).

Next, David introduced the evening's presenter, Dale Hammer, K9NN for his presentation on the Reverse Beacon Network (RBN) and CW Skimmer. Dale said the RBN was started in 2008 by VE3NEA with the advent of *CW Skimmer* software, which

was able to decode many CW signals from many monitoring stations using Software Defined Radios (SDRs) and broadband antennas at once and comparing them to callsign databases. The RBN software enabled tracking and search history of the received signals. FT mode decoding and tracking was added in 2019. The RBN software only considers a signal valid if received by more than one receiver. The RBN is a great tool to monitor real-time band conditions by comparing how your signal is heard in different locations. Dale showed RBN reports of his recent POTA activation using 3 watts from Arizona as heard from the W9VW station in Hancock County and the K9CT in Central Illinois. Dale shared several tips for RBN usage. Dale said that RBN data has been used for the past 10 years or so to confirm contest logs.

After Dale's presentation, Don, N9BGW won the drawing for the \$25 DX Engineering gift certificate.

## **WELCOME NET - INDY FINDS NEW HOME**

With the dismantling of the W9WIN linked repeater system, the "Welcome (to Amateur Radio) Net" has been divided into "regional" nets. In Indianapolis, we now have "The Welcome Net - Indy" on the W9ICE 146.97 (107.2 tone required) repeater. Since the 146.97 is the host of Central Indiana Skywarn nets, in the event of a weather net on the

repeater, the Welcome Net will be cancelled for that evening. The Welcome Net - Indy will continue to meet at 8:00 pm, Indianapolis time. The Welcome Net continues to be a great place for new hams to get used to using their radios. While these nets are intended to help new hams, all amateurs, whether licensed 1 week or 20+ years, are welcome to check in. Welcome Nets are "conversational nets", where after initial check-ins, a topic for discussion is posed by the net controller and then those that have checked in are encouraged to comment on the evening's topic. The Welcome Net would like to thank Dale Schieman, WB9YCZ and Frank Swindler, WB9OPR of the W9ICE group for their permission to use the 146.97 repeater for the Welcome Net – Indy.

## **INDIANA QSO PARTY COMING UP MAY 3**

The 2025 Indiana QSO Party is coming up Saturday, May 3, running from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm, Indianapolis time. This is a great time to get on the air, because everyone will be looking for Indiana stations. Several plaques and certificates are available for many categories for both in-state and out-of-state stations. Once again this year, there will be 10 "rare" counties (Brown, Cass, Clinton, Wabash, White, Morgan, Shelby, Miami, Carroll, and Switzerland) that will qualify for additional plaques. As of the writing of this newsletter, 73 of Indiana's 92 Counties have a commitment from at least one station to operate from them. Even if you can only get on for an hour or two, submit a log.

In the release, the Board stated that, "The relationship between Canada and the United States has become increasingly strained due to recent trade disputes and tariffs imposed by the US government."

## **POSTAGE RATES GOING UP IN JULY**

On April 9, the U.S. Postal Service filed notice with the Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) of mailing services price changes to take effect July 13. The new rates include a 5-cent increase in the price of a First-Class Mail Forever stamp from 73 cents to 78 cents. ## **Signals from the Past:**

**From the April, 1976 *Amachewer*:**

### **WARC-79**

The year 1979 will be a milestone in the world of communications when the World Administrative Radio Conference of the ITU will be held to re-examine uses of the radio spectrum. For hams, CB-ers and SWL, this conference will likely be the most important happening in a long time. The present division of the radio spectrum is based largely on major



changes made in 1947. At that time, meetings were dominated by leading nations in science and technology -- US, USSR, UK, and France. Expanded by the entry of new countries, membership at WARC-79 can be expected to be about one third higher than at 1947. Because each country has an equal vote, any under-developed country's vote holds as much weight as the US. Many of the new nations are indifferent to the radio advanced nations and couldn't care less about some radio services, namely Amateur, CB, and SWL. With the radio spectrum expected to expand up to 275 GHz., it's important for amateur radio to stake out its claim for the future. There don't seem to be too many counties today that will give strong support to amateur radio. So we in the US, with only one vote, need all the friends we can marshal at the upcoming WARC-79.
