Highlights from the May Meeting:

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Club President David Spoelstra, N9KT. There were 39 in attendance, including several guests. There were no new hams, members, or upgrades. David went over the stats from the club’s April POTA outing, noting Robert Whited, W9PRK, who came down from Wheatfield, IN, about a 2 hour drive! Next, Kyle, KC9GLR announced that he is gathering GOTA (Get On The Air) station operators for the Indy United Field Day effort. Anyone that is a new ham or has been “generally inactive” is eligible to be a GOTA operator. Contact Kyle at [gotat@kc9glr.com](mailto:gota@kc9glr.com) if you’re interested. Next, the Indiana QSO Party was discussed. Several of those present reported varying degrees of success in the INQP. David gave a recap of the Mini-Marathon, saying it was a success and commenting on the thrill of having thousands of runners pass by his location. Next, Doug, N9DR showed a Heathkit AM radio that he received as a gift (in kit form) in 1966. He said it still works, although he doesn’t put batteries in it very often.

Next, David introduced our speaker for the evening, Jessica Franklin, Director of System Operations for AES Indiana. Jessica first asked for a show of hands of the engineers in

the room (there were several). Jessica started by talking about North America's power grid, which encompasses Canada, the US, and Mexico. AES Indiana buys (and sells excess) power through MISO (Midcontinent Independent System Operator). *[As a side note, on MISO's [website](#), there are many near-real time displays available as to generating capacity, etc.]* She said the grid can shift quickly depending on loads. Jessica said that before the grid, there were many individual generating plants for commercial customers. Historically, she said that the first Hydro plants were built in 1870 and Indianapolis' "Perry K" plant was built in 1892. She said there has been lots of change in the past 5 years. AES IN has 3 wind farms, generating around 10% of IN daily consumption. There are also plans to put small nuclear generators online for high demand periods. Naturally, consumption mirrors the economy, with drops tracking the recession of 2009 and the pandemic lockdowns of 2020. She said big demand drivers now are the planned Data Centers. There are a few hundred engineers in the US that predict how to prevent blackouts, eliminating vulnerabilities in the grid. She said that solar storms can cause issues with distribution lines and terrestrial weather can affect loads.

On the distribution side, the high level power lines that run through Marion County are at 340 KV, while the "neighborhood distribution" lines are at 15 KV. She said that 3 major transmission lines have been lost so far this year due to severe storms. She talked about the "smart grid" system that is in place in the distribution system that can automatically reroute power as needed. She said there are pole mounted breakers at approximately every 400 customers. She said that AES IN strives for a maximum of 5% voltage deviation at the customer. After Jessica's presentation, there were a few good questions from those present.

To wrap up the night, Deb Elliot, KE9AXY won the \$25 gift certificate from DX Engineering.

JUNE 21 IS THE NEXT CLUB POTA EVENT

The next Indianapolis Radio Club Parks on the Air (POTA) operating event will be Saturday, June 21 at Fort Harrison State Park. We will plan to be on the air by noon with 2 HF stations.
