# **Highlights from the November Meeting:**

The meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm by IRC VP, Jim Brown, W0RLD. There were around 30 in attendance. This evening's presenter, Noy, KE9DBN was recognized as a new Technician class amateur. Jim introduced the current slate of officers for the election. There were no additional candidates nominated from the floor. With all of the current officers willing to serve another term in their current positions and no additional nominations from the floor, Jim declared by acclamation that the current slate would continue into 2026.

Next Jim introduced the presenter for the evening, Noy Winzigster, KE9DBN to give a presentation on drones and the technology used in them. Noy first started with a discussion of the control link vs. the video link (two separate technologies). He talked about digital vs analog video links and their advantages and disadvantages. Digital has a much higher video quality possible, but doesn't degrade gracefully; this is the importance of having a direct line-of-sight observer which is legally required. Analog has lower quality video, but relay systems (effectively, aerial repeaters) are more doable for control.

Regarding the anatomy of a drone, there are plastic and carbon fiber frame versions. Nov also discussed operating systems and flight control systems. There was also discussion of AIO (all-in-one) board vs. flight stack designs. Noy and his colleagues also compared architectures: HDzero, Walksnail, DJI, OpenIPC. There was talk about the FCC banning DJI's ability to get an FCC license effective Jan 01, 2026. This is not an issue for individuals, however professional drone users will be affected as they won't be able to license. The pros and cons of Fiber-optic were discussed: It's an unjammable link and has a range up to 100 km now. However, there are environmental issues and it is incredibly expensive. Discussion came up on how to get into flying quad drones. The concern is that you'll crash your only drone. He suggested starting with a sim-only radio where you can get started for as low as \$24. Drones are powered by LiPo batteries. There was a little discussion regarding the use of "Tiny Whoop" drones, which can allow people to fly in public places covertly. Noy said there is lots of information on YouTube. There is no need to pay for information on how to get into the hobby. Noy and his colleagues showed some of their drone technique at this point and this led to lots of discussion from those present.

Steve, K9MD won the door prize drawing for a DX Engineering \$25 gift certificate. [Thanks to Kyle, KC9GLR for providing notes from this meeting.]

#### **NOVEMBER 22 IS THE NEXT CLUB POTA EVENT**

The next Indianapolis Radio Club Parks on the Air (POTA) operating event will be Saturday, November 22 at Fort Harrison State Park. We will plan to be on the air by noon with 2 HF stations. We will be set up at our normal spot, in front of the Visitor Center. If you have heard of the POTA program, but not been able to take part, this is your chance! Even if you're not licensed for HF, there will be control operators on site to help get you on the air. Both radios will have 2 positions, one for the operator and one for a logger, in case you need help logging. As usual, we will be using the club's callsign of W9JP, but if you're registered with the POTA system, you will get credit for the QSOs you make. So, if you're new to HF or POTA, or even if you're an experienced operator, stop by on November 22. We'll try to make sure the new operators get a chance to get on the air, but with 2 radios, anyone that wants to get on should be able to.

This event is open to everyone, YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE A MEMBER OF THE IRC to attend. As usual, we will have coffee, donuts, and water available for refreshments. Even if you don't want to operate, just stop on by to chat with everyone.

#### **NEW DESIGN AMATEUR RADIO LICENSE PLATES COMING!**

Our ARRL Indiana Section Manager, Bob Burns, AK9R has been working with Indiana Bureau of Motor Vehicles staff over the past few weeks on a redesign of the Indiana Amateur Radio License Plate. The release date has yet to be determined. BMV is still

working out some details regarding this revised plate. Bob says that it's entirely likely that the plate won't be available until after the first of the year and asks everyone to be patient. Bob also says that the current \$8 fee for an amateur radio plate in Indiana is codified in State Law. Here's what the proposed new design will be:
