SOLAR CYCLE 24/25 UPDATE

The NOAA/NASA-co-chaired international Solar Cycle Prediction Panel has released its latest forecast for Solar Cycle 25. The panel's consensus calls for a peak in July 2025 (±8 months), with a smoothed sunspot number of 115. The panel agreed that Cycle 25 will be of average intensity and similar to Cycle 24. The panel additionally concurred that the solar minimum between Cycles 24 and 25 will occur in April 2020 (±6 months). If the solar minimum prediction is correct, this would make Solar Cycle 24 the seventh longest on record at 11.4 years. In its preliminary forecast released last April, the scientists on the panel forecast that Solar Cycle 25 would likely be weak, much like the current Cycle 24.

German special event station DL250BTHVN will be active between December 16, 2019, and December 17, 2020, to honor the 250th anniversary of the birth of famed composer Ludwig van Beethoven. The Beethoven anniversary year will take place under the auspices of Germany's Federal President Frank-Walter Steinmeier. Beethoven was born

in December 1770 in Bonn, Germany, and lived there for the first 22 years of his life. The anniversary event is aimed in part at highlighting Beethoven's extensive oeuvre as a composer and to boost Bonn's reputation as a "Beethoven city." QSL via direct or by the bureau.

THE FUTURE OF OUR HOBBY

I'm doing something here that I haven't done before, in writing an "editorial", if you will. Often, we hear or read about what can be done to get "young" people (defined for this as those under 60) interested in becoming hams. What prompted me to write this was a thread on an email reflector, where one of the posters proudly stated that he refuses to own a cell phone, citing as one part of his reasoning that "the government can't track me". In my opinion, thinking such as this only serves to reinforce some of the media portrayals of hams as being recluses that wear tin-foil hats to keep the government from reading their minds (mine would be a short story). We, as hams have to realize that if we have any serious intent to recruit others into our hobby, we need to shed that perception. Let's face it, the world in which we live is one that is COMPLETELY CONNECTED via the internet. Granted, one of the key factors that makes our hobby more than "just a hobby" is the fact that we can get our message through with or without infrastructure support, such as the internet. That's a good place to start if we're talking with "preppers" who don't want to rely on anything other than their own resources. However, if we're talking to the general public, especially the younger public, we need to embrace our networked world, rather than shun it. When the average 16 year old can text or talk to someone across the country, or on the other side of the world for that matter, with a device in their pocket, I think a good way to relate is with the internet reliant methods (EchoLink, IRLP, digital voice modes) where we can contact folks a long way off with just a handheld radio. Once we get their attention, then we can talk about the many other aspects of our hobby that keep us interested. Don't get me wrong, if you choose to not use a cell phone, that's fine. Just don't make that your basis for trying to "sell" someone on our hobby.
